This command in Matthew 28 is called the "Great Commission". [A commission is a duty or task or job that is given to us to do by someone in authority over us].

The Gospel must be taken to every "nation, tribe, people and language" (Rev 7: 9) around the whole world. This is the great work of the Church.

The Lord will not return until this job is completed – Matthew 24: 14.

The word used for "nation" in these two verses (Matt 24:14 & Rev 7:9) is the Greek word "ethnos", which means _____.

It is God's desire and plan that every people group, every culture, every part of the human family, will be represented in heaven when the Church is complete.

THE MOST EFFECTIVE WAY OF FULFILLING THE GREAT COMMISSION IS THROUGH PLANTING NEW CHURCHES.

Church growth statistics show that the most effective way of extending the Kingdom of God is through planting new Churches.

A new Church provides: -

- A new _____ in the new community.
People can see the church in action, they can hear the singing and the preaching. They can observe the lives of the members. They are constantly challenged by the existence of the Church in their village.
- A new point of _____ for the people of that community.
The kingdom of God is brought near them. It is easier for them to attend. The people in the Church can visit them and make friends with them.

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- A new _____ for God's love into that village.
The Church members reach out to help the people in the village in a practical way.

Making disciples

The Great Commission does not tell us to go and make _____ of all nations, but _____.

We are not just trying to get people born again, but grounded in the Word of God and living out lifestyle that Jesus demonstrated and commanded. It is a lifestyle of: -

These things can only be done effectively by Christians working together in a Church situation. Planting Churches is the only way to fulfill the command of the Great Commission - to make disciples.

2. *The Kingdom of God*

Matthew 5:33. We are commanded to have Kingdom priorities. Jesus clearly tells us that doing the work of His Kingdom is to the most important thing in our lives.

The Lord Jesus came for three main reasons:-

So, following the example of Jesus (John 20: 21), we see that the business of the Kingdom is saving souls, destroying the devil's work and bringing the abundant life in Jesus to the lost people of the world.

Again, the best and most effective way of doing this is by planting new Churches where new converts can find encouragement and strength in their own villages and communities and where the overcoming life in Jesus can be demonstrated to everyone.

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“Go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit”

CHURCH PLANTING REQUIRES:-

1. A correct theology.

We are “great commission” Christians. This is part of what being a Christian means. The great commission requires us to make **disciples**, not **converts**. The only way to do this is to plant churches. Jesus calls us to be **followers**, not just **fans**. Commitment and involvement are needed. C.f. *Matt 28:20*

The churches we plant are to be: -

- Self _____.

This means that leadership for the Church comes from within the Church. We must *look for, train and release* leaders within the Churches we plant. (This is the goal we work towards. To start with we might need to appoint a leader from outside).

- Self _____.

This means that money for supporting the Pastor and running the church comes from the people in the Church. We must train the people to give, to tithe and to work. We must teach them about the place and work of the Pastor and how to support him.

- Self _____.

This means that the Church must be involved in planting other Churches. We must teach and train the people to witness and to **be** witnesses. Teach them about being “Great Commission” Christians. We must teach them the importance of reaching out to the lost and planting other Churches among those who are near, and those who are far away. Acts 1:8. We must plant a “missionary vision” in the new Church right from the start. We must teach the people to have Kingdom priorities and to be involved in God’s work.

All of this must be settled in our minds before we start.

We are not just planting _____ Church.

We are planting a Church that will plant _____ Churches.

We are involved in the work of **Church Planting**. That is the work that Jesus has commanded all of us to do. It is not just for some Christians – the command was given to all of us, to the Church. We must all be involved in this in some way. If we do not go ourselves, we must help to support those who do go. This is what we are here to do.

This “theology”, or principle, should be clearly taught to everyone in the Church. Our Churches must not just be places where people are happy to come on Sunday and then forget about for the rest of the week. We have work to do, a task to accomplish, a command to fulfill, a duty to carry out for our Lord Jesus.

The Churches we plant should always be **indigenous**. That means they should have the style, culture, language and leadership of the local people as long as they do not go against the Bible’s teachings.

PRAY All successful Christian work begins here. Seek God’s leading, guidance, and blessing.

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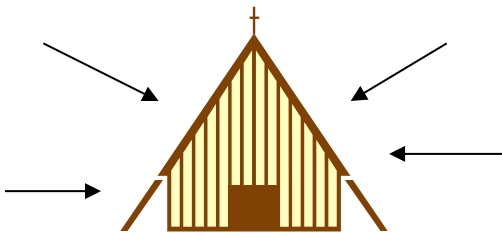
- They continued strong in _____

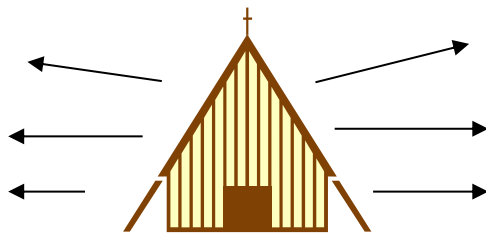
The Church is always to be a base for further evangelism and Church planting. The Church is a living thing and must grow. We must teach Christians to always be looking outward to the lost, not inwards to their own needs all the time.

Two ideas about the Church.¹



1. The Church as a building.

In this model, the building is the “holy place”. Everything that the Church does must happen in the building, including prayer, fellowship and evangelism. The Church is **inward** looking.



2. The Church as the people.

The Church (the people) meet in the building for worship and teaching but then go out into the world to do the work of God. This is the true Biblical model. The Church is **outward** looking.

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3) Strategy

- Is there a need for a new Church in this place?
- Are there any other good Churches nearby?
- Are there enough people to reach out to so the church will grow?
- Is the door open into that village?
- Will there be opposition and how will you deal with it?

- Do you have 'wantok' in that village you can go to?
- Can you get a job there, or nearby?
- Will you move there or just hold outreaches for a while?
- Will you start it as a home group?
- Will you send one of your leaders?

EIGHT CHARACTERISTICS OF A GROWING CHURCH

1) A Strong Commitment to _____

This does not just mean preaching the gospel inside the church building; it means going out into the community. A fisherman does not stay at home and throw his line out the window. He goes to where the fish are.

The church at Antioch was born this way (Acts 11: 20-21). Paul used the same idea in Acts 20:20, Acts 17:17.

Evangelism is the way a local church grows. The Church should have a vision and a plan to reach those close by and should also be involved in reaching out to those far away – even overseas (Acts 1: 8

A growing church is a church with a strong commitment to mission world-wide, starting with those next door.

2) A Strong Commitment to _____

When a visitor, or new person, walks into the church he must feel that the people in the congregation love the Lord, love each other, and love him.

There must be an atmosphere of caring about the physical and social needs of people in addition to their spiritual needs. C.f. the church at Antioch Acts 11:29, James 2:15-16.

The Holy Spirit through Jesus is showing that a living body of believers must care for one another in a very human and real way.

The Church leaders should concentrate on building big **people**, not just a big **Church**. If people feel their needs are being met, they will come.

3) A Strong Commitment to _____

The church at Antioch fasted, prayed and sent out missionaries. They were interested in the result of the missionary ministry of Saul and Barnabas. Later they sent Silas and John Mark.

This shows that they had made growth an important part of their goal as a church. Note Paul's words in Romans 15:20.

There should be a vision for the local Church to grow, together with a vision to plant other Churches.

4) A Strong Commitment to _____

The Antioch church was deeply committed to offering the praise of their hearts to God. Acts 13:2-3 "*As they ministered to the Lord and fasted...*"

It was said of the Church in Macedonia in 2 Corinthians 8:5 they "*first gave themselves to the Lord*".

Our first ministry as Christians and as a Church is to God in worship.

The Church leaders must take care to build up this part of Church life. Have good praise and worship.

5) A Strong Commitment to the _____ of the Saints

Some call it discipleship, others call it Christian Education, and some call it edification.

Whatever the name, it means to build the spiritual strength of the body of believers. Inward growth goes together with outward growth.

Of the church at Antioch we read:

Bible preaching, study and education are the foundations for internal growth and development of Spirit controlled men and women.

The Timothy Principle - 2 Tim 2:2

The result of this was found in Acts 11:26. The disciples were first called Christians at Antioch. The world looked at these saints and said "they are Christians". They not only spoke of Christ but they reflected the life of Christ. The priority of outreach and evangelism is DISCIPLESHIP according to Matthew 28:19, through reaching out, baptizing, and teaching.

6) Openness to _____

The church at Jerusalem sent Barnabas to investigate what was happening in Antioch (Acts 11:22) where some new things were being done. The Council of Jerusalem included reports of the tendency on the part of the Antioch church to do things differently! All that the saints at Antioch were doing was responding to God's revelation of Christ, which was given to Paul to preach.

The Apostle Paul was a man who did things in new ways, not just to be different, but because he wanted to reach people for Christ (1 Corinthians 9:22-23).

A local church needs to be able to adjust and change as the needs arise. We should not be like those people who always say things like: -

- "We have never done it that way before".
- "We are not ready for that".
- "We tried that once before".
- "We're doing alright without it".
- "It costs too much".
- "That's not our responsibility".
- "It just won't work".

We must be open for the Holy Spirit to give us new ideas for how to win the lost and worship God.

Seven steps to this kind of openness are given in 1Thess 5:16-22. The key verse is 14 *"Do not put out the Spirit's fire"*.

7) A Strong Commitment to _____ & _____.

Faithfulness is important to the Lord as we see in 1Cor 4: 2 *"It is required that those who have been given trust must prove faithful"*.

A growing church is characterized by men and women who are freely giving: -

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- Their _____ - faithfully attending
- Their _____ - faithfully helping however they can.
- Their _____ - faithfully and sacrificially giving.

They do this so that Christ might be honoured and His ministry advanced.

Where there is a growing church there is a church where members give freely and lovingly. There is a spirit of faithfulness and stewardship of time and talents. C.f. Paul in Acts 15:36

8) A Strong Commitment to _____.

A living, growing church is a praying church; a church that believes in and practices PRAYER.

The commitment to prayer must include the whole congregation. It is not just selecting one night of the week as prayer meeting night. Rather it involves the leaders and the members of the church in their commitment to growth through personal prayer.

It involves small prayer core groups, instruction and study on prayer, daily involvement in regular prayer for one another and for the growth of the church. Public sharing in prayer based on this will develop a strong commitment to growth.

SOME WORDS ABOUT CHURCH PLANTING:

1. Our aim in Church planting is to get _____ people into the Church.
We are not trying to get people from **other** Churches to change and come to **our** Church. Often when this happens, these people bring their problems with them. Also, this is not building the Kingdom of God.
We want to plant Churches where there are no good Churches. We want to get new people saved and make disciples of them.

We are not against other Churches. Do not preach against other Churches – this will close many doors for you and your message. Preach the Gospel – the good news about Jesus Christ.
